A guided walking tour highlighting the historical buildings in downtown Benicia, combined with a traditional tea service

WHAT: Downtown Benicia is rich in California's history with over 30 historical points of interest in the downtown area. Among its landmarks, the restored State Capitol is the most notable, dating from 1853. The historic downtown provides Victorian-inspired homes and "false-front western" architectural examples that date back to the 1850's and up to the turn of the century. Many of these buildings have been beautifully restored.
