The award amount will be a maximum of \$2,000. The quantity of scholarships will depend on the number and quality of applicants. Additionally, scholarship recipients will receive a complimentary one-year student membership to AEP, which includes all benefits of professional membership, including notification of social events and programs and reduced rates for the annual State AEP Conference and CEQA workshops. Notification of awards will be made by May 1, 2010. The scholarships will be awarded at a local social/networking event to be held in May or June 2010.
